Salt Lake City

Marilee and I took a trip to the Mormon Library and Archives in Salt Lake City, back in November. Got out just the night before the big snow storm. We had a very rewarding week of research, for one thing we now have the Goodspeed papers included in the data base. Unless some one can come up with some other hidden manuscript I have located all the older ones. To make our data base complete I must have your family group sheets including the immediate family, grand kids and mother in law.

Back to the trip. We flew in to the airport in Salt Lake. Called the Motel and transportation was there very quickly. We stayed at the Howard Johnson Motor Lodge, across the street from the Mormon complex. There is a genealogy store in the hotel for all your supplies, The restaurant is quite good but stay away from the baked goods. The Motel is clean, good service and they seem to want to help you at any time. It is located less than a half a block from the Library, across the street from the Temple, excellent access. The library has four floors in which to do your research, plenty of readers, fiche machines. computers and I've never seen so

many books on Genealogy in one building. My advice for any one that plans to visit, spend as much time as you can at your local Mormon Library and search the library catalog, ancestral files, IGI files and what ever else you can get your hands on that will give you the numbers corresponding to the data you are looking for. That way when you arrive at the library the only thing you have to do is to pull books, film, or fiche that has your data, and read away. Help is at your beck and call any time you need it. the library is well staffed, adequate facilities for copying documents when you locate them. If you are a serious researcher a trip there is a must. We have a cousin who is in the computer department, so when you visit be sure and say hello to Paul.

With out a doubt the people that I had the pleasure of associating with, were the most friendly people I have ever encountered in all my travels. I don't mean just the people in the Library but the towns people, went out of there way to help. (1994 Reunion in Salt Lake). Ladies wait till you see the malls, one within walking distance. There is another but you must have a ride but don't miss it.

This week I have sent to the library in Salt Lake a bound copy of all our news letters for their filming and display. Soon the film will be available through the Mormon Genealogical Branch Libraries. The Corys are very well represented in their archives, if you take the time to search there is much information on the Corys. I was going to send our Data base to them but in the last couple of weeks there has been an influx of material to enter. Nevertheless March 1st is the absolute dead line. The data base goes to the library. One thing about research, you never get through. Those of you who are members please send in your family group sheets to the society, if you send them to me the information will be preserved in perpetuity by being included in the computer data base, I am compiling. Note, please, your family and descendants are part of the big picture. Include them.
