103rd CONTINENTAL CONGRESS NATIONAL SOCIETY DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REUNION

Colors. The Pages, all dressed in their white gowns carried the Continental Flag and the National Ensign down the center aisle to the stage. Next came the procession of fifty one State flags all carried down the aisle by the pages to the stage crossing one side to the other to their resting place. Then the aisle was lined with the pages, lovely ladies all dressed in white gowns and gloves. The National chairmen and member dignitaries followed. Then the pages for the National officers followed by the National General Officers. More pages and then the President General of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution. When She arrived about midway down the Isle the band played the Star Spangled Banner and a large American flag unfolded from the ceiling and hung there for the rest of the meeting. This flag I estimate was about 14 by 24 feet. There were about 4500 ladies in attendance. Many wore beaded gowns. During the meeting the hall was aglow with sparkling stars from all the gowns.

The stage with all the lovely ladies all dressed in their finest looked like a bouquet of flowers. The address was given by The Honorable Phil Gramm, United States Senator from Texas. The Colors retired and the meeting was closed with organ music in the background.

Today there is a huge Cory/Corey family. The four stars are in honor of the first four Corys, who came to America in the 1600's. John, William, Thomas and Giles. Suggested colors for this Logo are, a silver shield with a wide blue strip having four white stars, the blue strips to have a border of a thin white stripe first then a red stripe, the eagle and oak symbols to be in natural color.
