PRESIDENTS CORNER:

One of the rewards of being active in the CFS is the pleasure in receiving word that one of our members has identified his ancestors. Over the years many of us have received letters from Charles Henry Cory of Auburn, NY looking for the ancestors of David Cory of Jordan, Onondaga Co, NY. I'm happy to report that the father of his ancestor Calvin Cory is David⁴ (David³, Isaac², John¹) who married #1 Eunice Allen, m #2 Rachel (Frost) Dallas, m#3 Sarah? David and Rachel were the parents of Calvin Cory⁵ and Rachel may have died during or shortly after childbirth. David⁴ moved most of his family from Parsippany, NJ to Bridgeport, Addison Co, VT to Onondaga Co, NY.

Charles has been diligently searching for clues to his family for many years as did his sister, mother, and grandmother before him. Charles is now over ninety and suffers from several eye problems, yet he still laboriously writes his letters by hand. We wish him many years of letter writing, after all he still wants to find the parents of John Lewis Corey (see Queries).


I hope that our many other members who have reached a dead-end on their searches will find encouragement from Charles' good luck when Erwin Fellows sent him an article from an old newspaper that provided the clue that unraveled his family mystery.

GENEALOGY

Rufus Cory was born Windham County, CT, married Olney d/o Hezakiah & Orpha (Hawkins) Olney. She was born in Windham County, CT. Rufus and Rachel were reported to have had thirteen children: names of twelve are known. They moved to Sesquehanna County, PA circa 1815 and both are buried in Lennox Twp, Sesquehanna, Co, PA. Jeremiah Olney Cory was born Windham Co, CT and was one of Rufus's youngest children. Died and buried in Marne, Shelby Co, Iowa. Married in 1855 to Anna Johnson of Livingston, IL and were the parents of Jeremiah apparently left home early, ioined the Army and fought in the Mexican War. In lieu of payment he was granted a 160 acre bounty homestead in IL. He sold this farm in 1876 and removed with his family to Clay Twp. in Shelby Co., IO.



Edwin Olney Cory, eldest child of Jeremiah & Anna Cory married Margaret Morgan Brown in 1885 and several years later purchased a 160 acre farm in Shelby Co., IO. When he died in 1905 of pneumonia, he left Margaret with seven children and a mortgaged farm. James Olney, the eldest, 19, was in poor health and never able to do heavy farm work.


Elizabeth (Bess) Flourence Corey, 17, had to leave school and following a summer course at normal school began to teach in a one room school in IO. In 1909 when she was twenty-one she moved to the Fort Pierre, South Dakota area determined to file on a homestead lot. Over the next ten years she proved up her homestead lot and taught in one room schools while sending home a continuous stream of letters, chronicling her adventures or misadventures. She began signing her letters "Bachelor Bess" in 1910 so maybe at this young age she consciously or not may have decided to remain unmarried in order to 'prove up' all by herself. Her meager salary paid to build and improve her ten by twenty tar paper shack, build other necessary farm buildings, dam up water, fence, plow, plant, and harvest crops. She battled rattlesnakes, blizzards, sub-zero temperatures, floods, droughts, and blistering heat. Few of her teaching contracts were near her homestead so she was unable to spend more than parts of her summers or holidays on her own land. During the dust bowl of the thirties she gave up all attempts to farm and sold the homestead in 1946. Her later years were troubled by a serious eye problem and she died May 5, 1954 of cancer.

Under the title of "Bachelor Bess" on hundred and eighty of her letters were arranged by her brother Paul, edited by Philip Gerber and published as part of the life and land series. Paul was also an author.

Gilbert Corey, nephew of Bess compiled a genealogy of the descendants of Jeremiah Corey and had a request in our CFS newsletter of July, 1994. Steven Barnboorn, a descendant of Chauncey Corey, son of Rufus Cory also has been in touch with CFS and had a request in our May 1992 newsletter.


