IF YOU ARE COMING FROM A DISTANCE, JUST GET SOME FOOD AT THE LOCAL GROCERY STORE ONCE YOU GET THERE. IF YOU CANNOT DO THAT, JUST COME ANYWAY--YOU ARE CORDIALLY INVITED!

WHEN YOU COME, PLEASE BRING ALL THE CORY FAMILY DATA YOU HAVE--FAMILY GENEOLOGICAL CHARTS, OLD FAMILY HISTORIES, OLD FAMILY PICTURES. IT WILL BE FUN TO SHARE WITH ONE ANOTHER AND LEARN FROM ONE ANOTHER, AND GET TO KNOW ONE ANOTHER.

ONE OF THE TREASURES OF THE CORY FAMILY IS THE OLD CORY BELL. MRS. MARY ST. JOHN WROTE THE STORY OF THE BELL, AND HER AUGUST 7, 1911, ACCOUNT READS:

"THE CORY BELL WAS BOUGHT BY ELNATHAN CORY, IN THE SECOND YEAR OF THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR IN WHICH HE SERVED SEVEN YEARS.

"ELNATHAN AND HIS NEIGHBOR WERE GOING HOME FROM A BATTLE WHEN THEY HEARD THIS BELL, AND THEY DECIDED TO FOLLOW ITS SOUND UNTIL THEY FOUND IT. THEY THOUGHT OF TURNING BACK SEVERAL TIMES, BUT PRESSED ON AND FOUND A LARGE OX WITH A BELL ON IT. THEY THEN WENT TO THE NEARBY CABIN AND ASKED THE OWNER IF HE WOULD SELL THE BELL. THE OWNER SAID HE WOULD TAKE A DOLLAR FOR EACH MILE THEY HAD TRAVELED, AND SAID, 'YOU ARE SOLDIERS FROM THE FIELD AND IT IS JUST FOUR MILES TO THE BATTLEFIELD, SO YOU MAY HAVE THE BELL FOR FOUR DOLLARS.' SO EACH MAN GAVE TWO DOLLARS.

THE OWNER OF THE BELL THEN SAID, 'WHEN YOU GET HOME, WHO WILL THE BELL BELONG TO?' HE SUGGESTED THAT ELNATHAN AND HIS NEIGHBOR DRAW CUTS FOR IT, AND THE WINNER OF THE BELL CAN REPAY THE LOSER WHEN THEY GET BACK HOME. THE PREVIOUS OWNER OF THE BELL TOOK TWO SPLINTS FROM A BROOM, THEY DREW CUTS, AND ELNATHAN WON. AND THIS IS HOW THIS BELL CAME TO BE IN THE CORY FAMILY. IT HAS BEEN PASSED ON FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION FROM 1778 TO THE PRESENT DAY, AND IS NOW IN THE POSSESSION OF MR. TOM VICKROY, OF SALEM, OHIO.

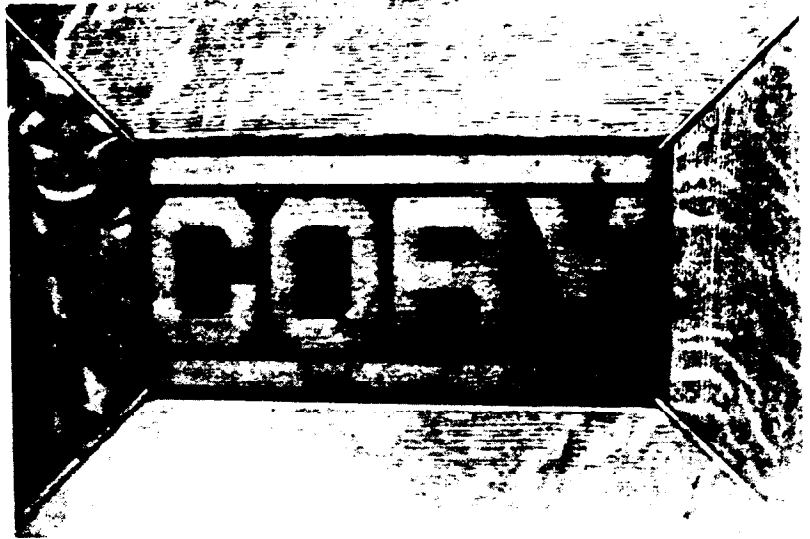
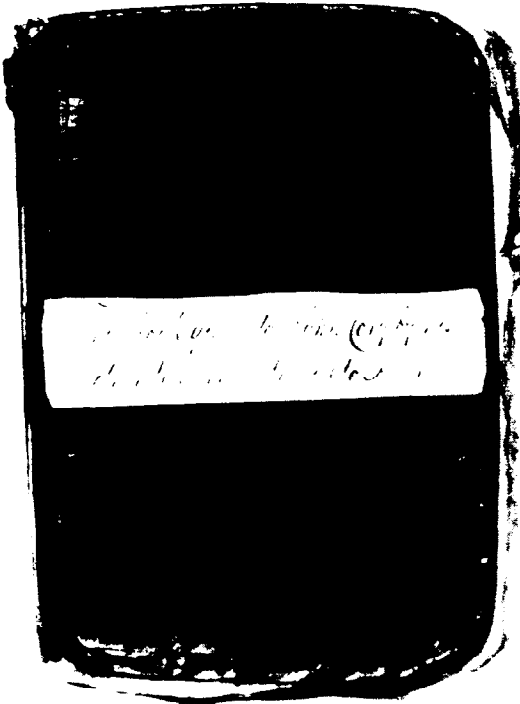


THE OLD CORY LOG CABIN, AS IT WAS IN 1930

ANOTHER OF THE CORY FAMILY TREASURES WAS THE CORY LOG CABIN. ELNATHAN CORY, 8th GENERATION IN THE UNITED STATES, BUILT THE LOG CABIN AROUND 1832-33 ON WHAT IS NOW OLD ROUTE 51, ABOUT TWO MILES WEST OF DARLINGTON, PA., WHAT IS ENOS VALLEY, PA. ELNATHAN MARRIED HANNAH BARTRAM IN 1824 AND THEY RAISED ALL OF THEIR CHILDREN IN THE LOG CABIN, SOME SIX CHILDREN. THE

THE 'GRATE BOOKE' IN THE CORY FAMILY



THE WOODEN BOX FOR THE "GRATE BOOKE"

THE "GRATE BOOKE" GIVEN TO JOHN CORY WHEN HE CAME TO THE STATES

THE "GRATE BOOKE", OR THE GREAT BOOK, IS THE OLDEST AND MOST TREASURED ITEM IN THE CORY FAMILY TODAY. IT HAS SURVIVED 350 YEARS OF FAMILY POSSESSION, PLUS A LONG AND HAZARDOUS OCEAN JOURNEY IN 1640.

THE "GRATE BOOKE" IS A TREATISE ON THE BIBLE. ITS AUTHOR IS REV. RICHARD ROGERS, A MINISTER WHO WAS BORN IN 1550 AND DIED 21 APRIL 1618, AT WEATHERSFIELD, SUSSEX, ENGLAND. THE "BOOKE" IS ON HEAVY ENGLISH PARCHMENT AND PUBLISHED IN SCOTLAND, WHICH WAS USUAL FOR QUAKER AND PROTESTANT RELIGIOUS BOOKS.

JOHN CORY¹ WAS THE FIRST TO HAVE POSSESSION OF THE BOOK, ACCORDING TO ALL RESEARCH. JOHN CORY PROBABLY ORIGINALLY CAME FROM BRAMERTON HALL, NEAR NORWICH, NORFOLKSHIRE, ENGLAND IN OR ABOUT 1640 TO AMERICA, IMMIGRATING TO SOUTHOLD, LONG ISLAND. IN THE BOOK IT IS WRITTEN: "THIS BOOK GIVEN TO HOHN CORY BY HIS MOTHER TO CARRY WITH HIM TO AMERICA." JOHN CORY DIED IN 1685 AND WILLED THE "GRATE BOOKE" TO HIS SON, JOHN CORY².

JOHN CORY² WAS BORN ABOUT 1639, PROBABLY ON LONG ISLAND AND MARRIED MARY CORNISH. HE LIVED HIS LIFE AT HUNTINGTON, LONG ISLAND, AND WHEN HE DIED IN 1687 OR 1688, WILLED THE "GRATE BOOKE" TO HIS SON, JOHN CORY³.

JOHN CORY³ WAS BORN AT HINTINGTON, LONG ISLAND, BUT MOVED AT A YOUNG AGE TO ELIZABETH, NEW JERSEY, WHERE HE DIED IN 1772. HE WILLED THE BOOK TO HIS SON, ELNATHAN.

BRAMERTON HALL AND ST. PETER'S CHURCH, ENGLAND

"BRAMERTON HALL, PICTURED BELOW, WAS THE PLACE OF RESIDENCE OF THE CORY FAMILY FROM AT LEAST 1250 TO 1610, AND PROBABLY MUCH LONGER. BRAMERTON IS SITUATED FOUR MILES SOUTHEAST FROM THE CITY OF NORWICH IN THE SHIRE OF NORFOLK, ENGLAND," SO STATES ALMA LEE McCOWIN IN 1982. THE OLD CORY HALL IS THE BUILDING ON THE LEFT IN THE PICTURE BELOW, AND THE BUILDING ON THE RIGHT WAS CONSTRUCTED IN 1830. THE OLD CORY HALL FELL INTO DISREPAIR AND WAS TORN DOWN IN 1869, AND ON THE SITE A NEW BUILDING STANDS TODAY. THE TREE TO THE LEFT IN THE PICTURE BELOW IS AN OAK, 30 FEET IN DIAMETER, AND WAS STILL STANDING IN 1933.



TWO VIEWS OF OLD ST. PETERS CHURCH, NEAR BRAMERTON HALL, BRAMERTON, ENGLAND

ST. PETER'S CHURCH IS LOCATED NEARBY TO BRAMERTON HALL, AND WAS BUILT BEFORE THE CONQUEST IN 1066. THE CHURCH STILL STANDS TODAY AND IS AN ACTIVE CHURCH IN THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND.

IN A LETTER TO MARK HESTER IN 1984, THE SECRETARY OF THE CHURCH COUNCIL WROTE OF THE SMALL BRASS PLAQUE IN THE WALL IN THE CHANCEL AREA, TO THE LEFT OF THE ALTAR, WHICH READS IN OLD ENGLISH:

Here lyeth intered the body of Robert Cory who after a longe and tedious sicknefse Above 4 yeares continuance WCH he endured WTH much pacience dyed of his Age, leaving behinde him A second wife and six sonnes and two daughters which he had by his First wife.

THERE IS ALSO AN OLD BELL IN ST. PETER'S CHURCH THAT CRASHED TO THE FLOOR AROUND

1924. MR. AUBREY A. BLAKE, THE THEN OWNER OF BRAMERTON HALL, RECAST THE BELL THAT YEAR, WITH THE ORIGINAL INSCRIPTION WHICH READS:

Thomas Cory anno donini 1609
Recast 1924, A.A.B. (And the bell founder's mark)

OLDEST CHILD, WILLIAM SMITH CORY, LIVED IN THE LOG CABIN MOST OF HIS ADULT LIFE. HE ALSO INHERITED FROM HIS FATHER THE "GRATE BOOKE."

WILLIAM SMITH CORY LIVED IN THE LOG CABIN UNTIL HIS DEATH IN 1831, AND SOME OF THE CORY DESCENDANTS CONTINUED TO LIVE IN THE CABIN. AN ADDITION WAS PUT ONTO THE CABIN IN LATER YEARS TO MAKE IT MORE OF A HOUSE, BUT SOMETIME IN THE 1970'S THE LOG CABIN WAS PARTIALLY BURNED MAKING IT UNINHABITABLE. ALL THE LOGS, SOME BELIEVED TO BE WALNUT, WERE SOLD TO A MAN, ONE FOSTER McCARLS OF TIPPAWA, PA., TO BUILD A HOUSE.

IN 1984 AN ATTEMPT WAS MADE TO PURCHASE FROM MR. McCARLS SOME OF THE LOGS, BUT TO NO AVAIL. SOME OF THE LOGS HAD BEEN USED IN THE BUILDING OF A HOUSE, AND THE REST APPEAR TO BE UNFORTUNATELY NOT FOR SALE. A FURTHER ATTEMPT WILL BE MADE TO SECURE SOME OF THE LOGS TO PRESERVE THE MEMORY OF THIS OLD CORY TREASURE OF A LOG CABIN.

ELNATHAN CORY⁴ WAS BORN IN ELIZABETH, N.J., AND THERE HE MARRIED SARAH SIMPSON IN 1729. ELNATHAN DIED IN 1766 AND LEFT THE BOOK TO HIS SON, EBENEZER.

EBENEZER CORY⁵ WAS BORN IN ELIZABETH, N.J., IN 1730. HE DIED IN 1785, AND BROKE TRADITION BY LEAVING THE "GRATE BOOKE" TO HIS SECOND SON, ELNATHAN.

ELNATHAN CORY⁶ WAS BORN IN 1759 IN ELIZABETH, N.J., AND MARRIED SARAH WALKER IN 1778. HE WAS A SOLDIER IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR, AND THE PURCHASER OF THE CORY BELL. SOON AFTER THE TREATY WAS SIGNED, HE MOVED TO WESTMORELAND COUNTY, PA. AND LIVED THERE FOR 14 YEARS BEFORE MOVING TO BEAVER COUNTY, PA. IN 1800. HE DIED ON 14 FEBRUARY 1838 IN BEAVER COUNTY, PA. HE GAVE THE BOOK TO HIS SON, JOHN.

JOHN CORY⁷ WAS BORN IN 1778 IN NEW JERSEY, AND WAS MARRIED TO MARY CARBAUGH, PROBABLY IN WESTMORELAND COUNTY, PA. HIS SON, ELNATHAN, RECEIVED THE BOOK AFTER JOHN'S DEATH IN 1845.

ELNATHAN⁸ WAS BORN IN 1800 IN BEAVER COUNTY, PA., AND MARRIED HANNAH BARTRAM. ACCORDING TO RECORDS, HE IS THE LAST OF THE CORYS TO BE NAMED ELNATHAN, THOUGH HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS CALLED HIM "NATHAN."

WILLIAM SMITH CORY⁹ WAS THE ELDEST SON OF ELNATHAN AND SO INHERITED THE BOOK. WILLIAM WAS BORN IN BEAVER COUNTY, PA., IN 1837, AND DIED IN 1931. DURING THIS TIME THAT WILLIAM HAD THE BOOK, JAMES ENOS CORY MADE A CASE OF WOOD FOR THE BOOK AS SHOWN IN THE PICTURE, PAGE 3 OF THIS NEWSLETTER. ON THE FRONT OF THIS CASE IS THE NAME "CORY," IN LAID IN WOOD. IT IS MADE OF FOUR DIFFERENT TYPES OF WOODS, THAT SPELL THE CORY NAME AS FOLLOWS: Cherry, Oak, Rosewood, and Yule. WILLIAM SMITH CORY DIED IN 1931, AND GAVE THE BOOK TO HIS SON, SIDNEY CORY.

SIDNEY CORY¹⁰ HAD THE "GRATE BOOK" UNTIL HIS DEATH, WHEN HE GAVE IT TO HIS DAUGHTER, MAE CORY VICROY¹¹ PRESENTLY OF SALEM, OHIO, WHO NOW HAS THE BOOK. 350 YEARS AND 11 GENERATIONS LATER, THE "GRATE BOOKE" IS STILL A PROUD CORY FAMILY TREASURE THAT REMINDS US OF OUR PAST STRONG FAMILY TIES.

ELNATHAN CORY: REVOLUTIONARY PATRIOT

ELNATHAN CORY WAS OF THE SIXTH GENERATION FROM JOHN CORY, WHO IMIGRATED TO AMERICA AROUND 1638 FROM ENGLAND. ELNATHAN WAS BORN IN ESSEX COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, IN 1759, TO EBENEZER AND MARY MILLS CORY.

IN AUGUST OF 1775 ELNATHAN LEARNED THAT THE BRITISH HAD TAKEN POSSESSION OF STATEN ISLAND, AND HE VOLUNTEERED UNDER GENERAL POTTER. HE WAS ATTACHED TO THE REGIMENT COMMANDED BY COLONEL SPENCER FOR TWO MONTHS, THE SECOND MONTH OF WHICH HE SERVED AS A SUBSITUTE FOR DANIEL BARKER--A COMMON PRACTICE AT THAT TIME. SOMETIME IN THE SPRING OF 1776 HE VOLUNTEERED UNDER CAPTAIN GRAIN. UNDER HIS COMMAND A CAMPAIGN WAS BEGUN TO RECAPTURE ELIZABETHTOWN, N.J., FROM THE BRITISH. FOUR MILES FROM THE TOWN A PARTY OF HESSIONS DISCOVERED THEM AND LAID FIRE! THE FRONT GUARD TO WHICH HE BELONGED CLOSED IN UPON THE ENEMY AND TOOK SIXTY HESSIONS. THEY WERE ABLE TO RECAPTURE ELIZABETHTOWN, AND ELNATHAN SERVED AS GUARD EVERY OTHER NIGHT DURING THE WHOLE OF THE CAMPAIGN!

IN THE MONTH OF EITHER JULY OR AUGUST, 1776, ELNATHAN SERVED AS MILITIA MAN FOR ONE MONTH UNDER HIS UNCLE, JAMES CORY. NOT UNTIL THE MONTH OF AUGUST IN 1778 DID HE VOLUNTEER FOR SERVICE AS A MILITIA MAN FOR ONE MONTH AND MARCHED UNDER CAPTAIN DANIEL WOODS. JUST BEFORE THE CLOSE OF THE WAR, HE SERVED ONE OTHER SHORT CAMPAIGN AGAINST THE NATIVE AMERICANS AT A PLACE CALLED THE MINESINKS NEAR THE NEW YORK LINE UNDER CAPTAIN BECHWITH.

IN MAY, 1778, ELNATHAN CORY MARRIED SARAH WALKER, THE DAUGHTER OF RICHARD AND SARAH WALKER, BY THE REV. HONATHAN ELMORE. IN 1787 THE FAMILY MOVED TO WESTMORELAND COUNTY, PA., AND THEN IN 1800 MOVED TO BEAVER COUNTY, PA. BOTH ELNATHAN AND SARAH WERE MEMBERS OF THE MT. PLEASANT PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH WHICH WAS THEN LOCATED JUST OUTSIDE THE PRESENT VILLAGE OF DARLINGTON, PA.

STARTING IN 1834, ELNATHAN RECEIVED A PENSION FOR HIS SERVICES IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR, WHICH TOTALFD \$ 28.00 PER YEAR, TO BE PAID EVERY FOURTH DAY OF SEPTEMBER AND FOURTH DAY OF MARCH ANNUALLY.

IN BEAVER COUNTY, PA., ON 14 FEBRUARY 1838, ELNATHAN CORY DIED OF "CONSUMPTION." SARAH CORY DIED 20 OCTOBER 1843, AND SHE IS BURIED NEXT TO HER HUSBAND IN THE OLD MT. PLEASANT PRESBYTERIAN CEMETERY IN DARLINGTON, PA.

IT WAS THIS ELNATHAN CORY WHO PURCHASED THE CORY BELL WHICH IS STILL IN THE POSSESSION OF THE PRESENT DAY CORY FAMILY. ELNATHAN CORY LEAVES HIS NUMEROUS DESCENDANTS, MANY STILL RESIDING IN THE BEAVOR COUNTY, PA. AND COLUMBIANA COUNTY, OHIO, AREAS, A VERY RICH HISTORY AND HERITAGE DEDICATED TO FREEDOM.

THE D.A.R. AND YOU!!!

THE NATIONAL SOCIETY DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION WAS FOUNDED IN 1890 WITH A PRESENT MEMBERSHIP EXCEEDING 122,000, MAKING THIS THE LARGEST AND BEST KNOWN OF THE HEREDITARY SOCIETIES. MEMBERSHIP IS BASED ON DESCENT FROM AN ANCESTOR WHO SERVED THE CAUSE OF AMERICAN INDEPENDENCE IN THE MILITARY, AS A RECOGNIZED PATRIOT, OR BY RENDERING MATERIAL AID.

THERE HAVE BEEN MANY MEMBERS OF THE CORY FAMILY JOINING THE D.A.R. THROUGH ELNATHAN CORY OF BEAVER COUNTY, PA, AND/OR HIS FATHER, EBENEZER. THIS LINE OF THE CORY FAMILY IS FAIRLY WELL DOCUMENTED. FOR FURTHER INFORMATION ON THE D.A.R., ONE SHOULD WRITE TO THE FOLLOWING ADDRESS:

CONNECTING THE DEVON AND NORFOLKSHIRE CORYS

CORY FAMILY HISTORIANS KNOW THAT JOHN CORY AND SOME OTHER CORYS CAME TO AMERICA AROUND 1640, FROM NEAR NORWICH, NORFOLKSHIRE, ENGLAND. AND THE CORY FAMILY FROM THIS NORFOLKSHIRE AREA CAN TRACE THEIR FAMILY BACK TO BEFORE 1250.

THERE IS A BRANCH OF THE CORY FAMILY ALSO FROM CORNWALL COUNTY AND DEVONSHIRE, ENGLAND, THAT CAME TO THE UNITED STATES AROUND 1853, SETTLING MAINLY IN THE MIDWEST. THIS BRANCH OF THE CORY FAMILY CAN TRACE THEIR ROOTS BACK TO AT LEAST 1690 IN DEVONSHIRE, AND ARE WORKING TO PUSH THAT DATE BACK EVEN FURTHER.

TO DATE, TO OUR KNOWLEDGE, THERE HAS NOT BEEN THE VERIFIED, DOCUMENTED TIE IN BETWEEN THESE TWO BRANCHES OF THE CORY FAMILY--THOUGH IT IS ASSUMED AS THE CREST IS ESSENTIALLY THE SAME. IF YOU HAVE ANY VERIFIED, DOCUMENTED INFORMATION ON THE TIE IN BETWEEN THESE TWO BRANCHES OF THE CORY FAMILY, PLEASE MAKE CONTACT WITH REV. JACK R. CORY, 9744 SOUTH MASON, OAK LAWN, ILLINOIS, 60453, AND HE WILL SHARE INFORMATION WITH YOU. THANK YOU!

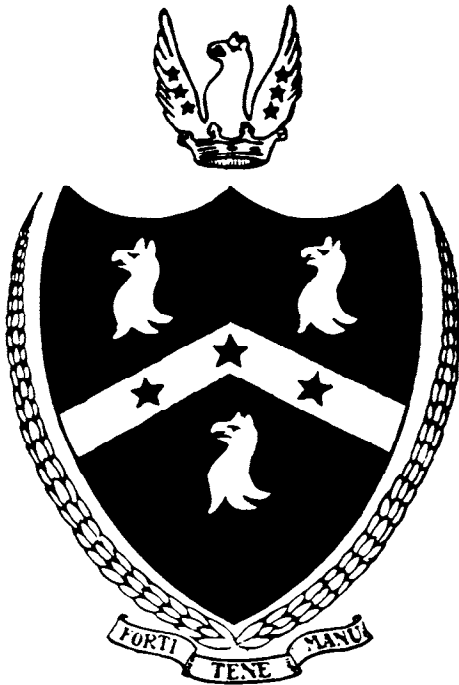
CORYS OF SCOTLAND AND ENGLAND: SAME FAMILY ? ?

THERE HAS BEEN SEVERAL ATTEMPTS MADE TO WRITE ABOUT THE CONNECTION OF THE CORRIES FROM SCOTLAND AND THE CORYS IN THE VARIOUS PARTS OF ENGLAND. TO OUR KNOWLEDGE, THIS TIE IN HAS NOT BEEN FULLY DOCUMENTED OR VERIFIED FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION. IN FACT, SOME CORY HISTORIANS TAKE THE STAND THAT THERE IS NO TIE IN WITH THE CORRIES AND CORYS. AUTHOR JESSIE ELIZABETH CORRIE, IN HER BOOK, RECORDS OF THE CORRIE FAMILY, TWO VOLUMES, TRACES THE SCOTTISH CORRIES BACK TO 802, BUT DOES NOT MAKE THE TIE IN WITH THE ENGLISH CORYS.

ARMS OF CORY—Sable, on a chevron, between three griffins' heads, erased or as many estoiles, gules.

CREST—Out of a ducal coronet, a griffin's head between two wings or, each wing charged with three estoiles, in pale, gules.

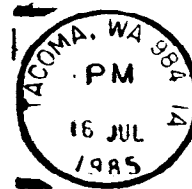
MOTTO—"Forti Tene Manu" (hold with a firm hand.)

These arms, granted to Sir John Cory of "Bramerton Hall," Norwich, England, in 1612, by James I and confirmed to his son, Sir Thomas Cory, of "Bramerton Hall" by Charles I in 1637.

Note: There was an old print of the Coat-armor copied from an engraving on a pitcher once owned by Mr. Corrie, of Sag Harbor, L. I., who brought it from London in 1799.
